Inspire+ Apprenticeships -

Employ an Apprentice in your school next academic year to enhance your PE & School Sport provision.

Inspire Together are working together with Inspire+ to bring their leading apprenticeship programme to Leicester. The partnership will see an education hub established in the city to enable apprentices to access learning locally and to work closely with a group of peers in their area. An apprentice can be employed to improve/increase the amount of physical activity & support PE lessons each week as well as offering classroom support. Depending on previous experience of an apprentice it is often the case that the apprentice supports in a variety of capacities including pastoral and behaviour roles.

An apprentice can:

- Support staff to deliver fun, inclusive and engaging physical activity.
- · Lead breakfast and after-school clubs, providing great opportunities for the children to get active and assist with in-class focus.
- Provide one-to-one mentoring for higher-ability pupils or those requiring Additional Learning Support
- Promote PE, sport, and well-being by organising and participating in clubs or sports events and leading physical activity initiatives.

A fully supported recruitment process:

Inspire+ have a dedicated recruitment officer to assist you in finding your perfect apprentice. They promote through national platforms via Indeed and Gov.uk, there is no charge to schools for this service. We pass on any applications to schools who we consider appropriate and pass the initial selection phase. We do, however, ask schools to advertise via their school website or other available platforms to them. Inspire+ do not charge any additional costs for recruitment, administration or training.

Active in Mind

The Crown Hills programme started this week! Yasmin Clarke, Ex - Tennis professional and BBC and Eurosport's commentator joined students at Crown Hills to kick start the Active in Mind Programme for this year. Active in Mind is a programme that sees a group of Year 9/10s identified as peer mentors. they receive a day's training on how to be a mentor for their peers as well as taking a look at their own Health and lifestyle habits. A 'nurture group' is also identified this is a smaller group of younger children who the Mentors will then support for 6 weeks through an active lunch club. The nurture group join the mentors for the afternoon training where the young mentors deliver some games and activities.
