INCLUSIVE LEADERSHIP

PLANNING & DELIVERING EVENTS

As part of our role as LLR lead inclusion school we delivered an inclusive leadership project, inspiring and developing secondary aged SEND students from both special schools & mainstream schools. Young People from four schools attended an Inclusive Leadership Day which was delivered in partnership with Sam Ruddock, a Paralympian & Youth Sport Trust athlete mentor. The leaders learnt about inclusive activities and how to collaborate to deliver activities for children with additional needs.



The young people participated in many activities throughout the day, focusing on the skills needed to be a good leader and practising setting up and delivering activities to each other, adapting the activities depending on the ability of the participants. One pupil proudly said at the end of the day:

"I have learnt how to adapt activities for people in a wheelchair and how to make activities better to include everyone."

The second part of the programme involves the leaders that attended the training day delivering an inclusive multi-activity event for SEND children – putting into practice what they had learnt and creating an inclusive event that everyone can enjoy.

The leaders from two of the schools delivered an event to secondary aged pupils with varying disabilities, using the skills and activities that they had gained at the leadership day to create a fun, active festival that was challenging yet inclusive for everyone who attended, whatever their ability. They delivered a great event that showcased their skills as leaders & participants thoroughly enjoyed.

The leaders from the other two schools will be delivering a similar event to primary aged children later in the summer term.
